Some combinations of courses may lead to a 'minor endorsement' on the transcript:

- minor **Law and governance in Europe**: the combination of the three courses Legal philosophy, Governments and constitutions, Law in Europe - from Gaius until the EU;
- minor **Human rights law**: the combination of the three courses European human rights, International human rights, Human rights of women
- minor **Criminal justice**: three courses to be chosen from Criminology, European criminal justice area, Human rights of women, Comparative criminal procedure

Students are to choose two courses per period, with the exception of the third period when just one course should be taken. Bachelor's students take two courses from the bachelor's programme, master's students can choose freely from both bachelor's and master's courses. Bachelor's students who have finished at least two years of their law bachelor's programme at the home university are allowed to take one bachelor's course plus one master's course per period; note however, that the level of the master's courses is substantially higher! For extra courses permission needs to be asked. Permission will only be granted if very special reasons apply.
