

Application Instructions

It is the policy of Washburn University School of Law to provide equality of opportunity in legal education for all persons without discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, national or ethnic origin, sex, age, handicap or disability, or sexual orientation.

Academic Eligibility. To qualify for admission, you must have completed a four-year college course of study and hold a four-year baccalaureate degree from an institution accredited by a regional accrediting association. Preference will be given to students who have a strong undergraduate record and substantial prior professional experience.

Deadline. Applications are considered on a rolling basis. Priority is given to applications received by March 15th for the Fall semester start and by October 15th for the Spring semester start.

Required Application Materials. Your application must include the following:

- Completed Washburn Law M.S.L. application form.
 - In responding to any question on the application, it is always better to err on the side of disclosure.
 - Answering "yes" to any of the Character and Fitness items in question 11 does not preclude you from being admitted to the M.S.L. program.
- Personal statement (300-1,000 words) explaining how Washburn Law's M.S.L. program would relate to your chosen career path, work experience, or personal or professional goals.
- Resumé (see M.S.L. application form for list of items to include).
- Two (2) letters of recommendation and official transcripts, sent directly to:

Submit both letters of recommendation from individuals, unrelated to you, who can evaluate your

- academic potential. *If you are seeking a waiver of the standardized test score requirement*, one of your recommenders must be a current or former employer with personal knowledge of your intellectual ability, character, work ethic, and substantial work experience.
- Submit official transcripts directly from *all* universities, colleges, or professional schools that you have attended, whether or not you graduated, *to* Washburn Law.
- A score on the Law School Admission Test (LSAT). An LSAT score may be substituted with a score on the Graduate Record Examination (GRE), Graduate Management Admissions Test (GMAT), an advanced degree, or a minimum of five years of experience related to the projected field of study.

If separation was for less than honorable conditions, attach a separate sheet explaining the circumstances.
